Heifer International's South Central Partner Meeting occurred on June 7-9, at the sprawling Lowery Woodall Center in Hattiesburg, Ms with more than 100 project partner members in attendance from Mississippi, Louisiana and Arkansas. HPI's South Central Office is currently working with 30 projects disproportionately affected by poverty, which contributes to health disparities, high school dropout, crimes, and illicit activities. Nevertheless, the South Central Office of Heifer International is working feverishly to make a huge impact on these impoverished rural communities by providing leadership, animals, seeds and other valuable resources to help save rural America. Matthew Moore of Zachary, Louisiana stated Heifer International has provided his community with animals to stimulate economic growth and improve the quality of life.
